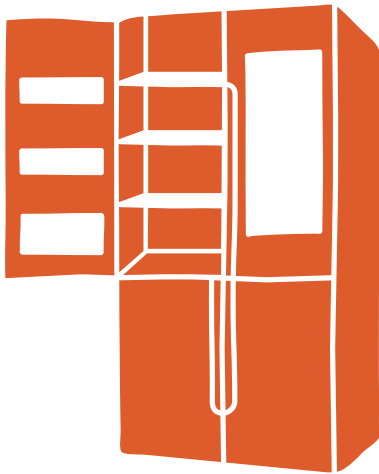

Allergen guidance poster

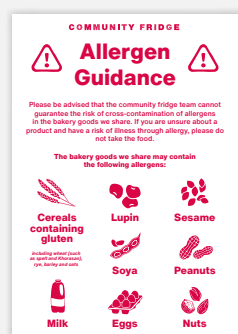
This is an essential poster to display at your fridge as it reminds visitors that you cannot guarantee the risk of cross-contamination of allergens.

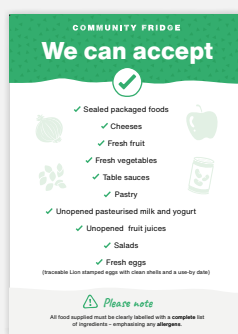

Accepted and not accepted lists

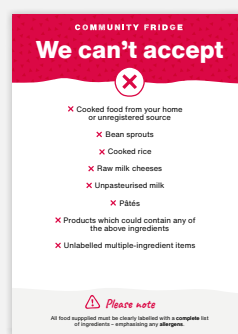
Display these lists so that visitors know which foods you can and can't accept.

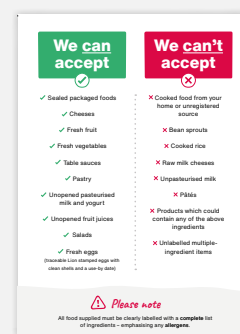

If you need help working with Canva to edit your posters, check out the helpful guidance at the end of this document.

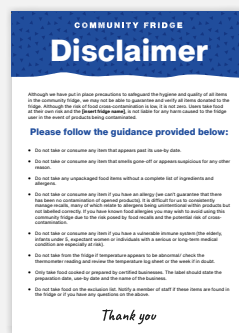
HEALTH AND SAFETY

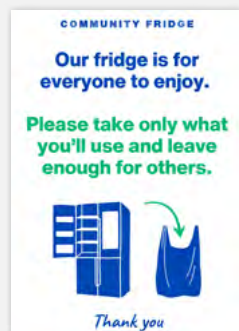

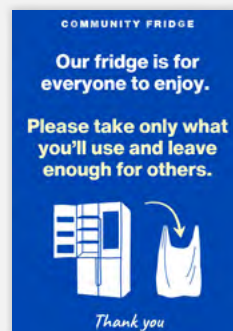
'Take what you need' poster

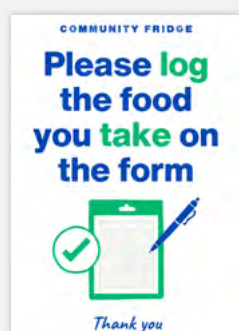

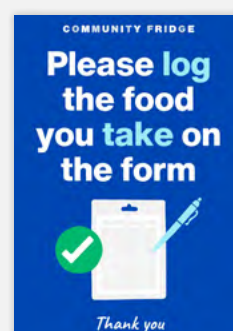
Log reminder poster

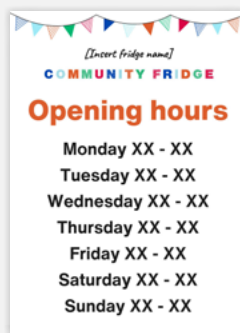

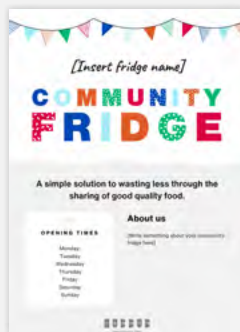

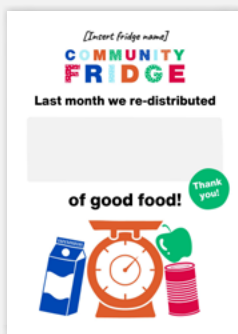

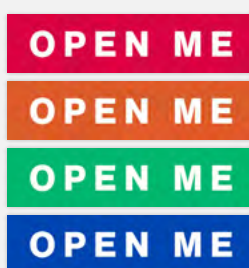


STICKERS & SIGNS

Personalise using Canva

1 Set up a free account

Visit www.canva.com and click the **Sign up** button in the top right corner. Follow the instructions to set up your account. This will mean any designs you edit will be saved to your account for you to amend or print whenever you need.

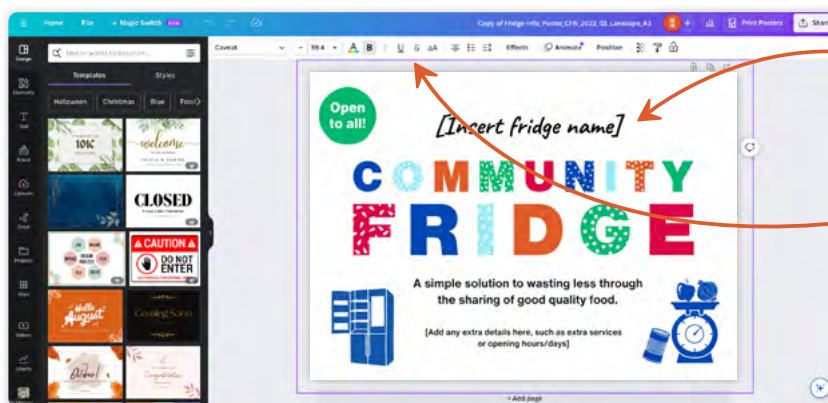
Tip

If you're a registered nonprofit or social impact org you can upgrade to a Canva Pro account for free, giving you additional features. See the eligibility guidelines and apply here: www.canva.com/canva-for-nonprofits/eligibility-guidelines

2 Choose a design to edit

Click the button for the size and colour of the design you want to edit from this document. This will open a new tab in your browser. Click **Use template for new design** to open the template and start customising with your fridge info. All changes you make are saved automatically.

3 Personalise your posters



Click on text sections to add your own info, such as fridge name and opening hours

Use the toolbar to adjust the size of text

4 Download your poster, sign or sticker

Click **Share** in the top right corner and select **Download** from the list. This will bring up some options. For File type, choose **PDF Print** from the dropdown list.

If you plan to get the poster professionally printed, or if you plan to trim the white border after printing at home, tick **Crop marks and bleed**. Tick the box to **Flatten PDF**. For Colour Profile, choose **CMYK** if you have a Canva Pro account (this is the preferred colour profile for printers). If you don't have a Pro account, it's not a problem, just tick RGB instead.
